

CITY OF CLAREMONT – IN THE YEAR TWO THOUSAND AND TEN

ORDINANCE #517

“STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING”

The City of Claremont Ordains:

Pursuant to New Hampshire RSA 47:17, the Claremont City Code is hereby amended to revise Article V of Chapter 19, regulating the use stopping, standing and parking of vehicles within the City of Claremont, as follows:

Section 1. 19-92. Two-Hour Parking

Section 19-92 is amended to add the following location:

Winner Municipal Parking Lot: Pleasant Street, east side, north of Summer Street, as shown on Tax Map 120-106.

Section 2. 19-95. Night Parking Restricted

Section 19-95 is amended to revise the third sentence of Subsection (a) so that it shall read:

This subsection shall not apply to the Municipal Parking Lot on Franklin Street, the Winner Municipal Parking Lot or to the area of the Rotary Island in Opera House Square known as the “bullpen.”

Section 3. Section 19-96. Municipal Parking Lots

Section 19-96 is amended to add the following location to Subsection (a):

Winner Municipal Parking Lot: Pleasant Street, east side, north of Summer Street, as shown on Tax Map 120-106.

Section 19-96 is amended to add a new second sentence of Subsection (b) as follows:

Parking in the Winner Municipal Parking Lot is available on a 24-hour basis, unless otherwise posted by the City.

Section 19-96 is amended to revise the last sentence of Subsection (b) so that it shall read:

The snow removal restrictions as stated herein shall not be applicable to parking in the Municipal Parking Lot on Franklin Street, the Winner Municipal Parking Lot or to the area of the Rotary Island in Opera House Square known as the "bullpen."

Section 4. Validity

If any article, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 5. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced immediately upon passage.
