CLAREMONT, NH – To assure credits are applied to the current tax year, all new applications to the assessing office for tax credits and exemptions are typically submitted prior to April 15th. This year, taxpayers who wish to apply are encouraged to do so by July 15th so that enough time is available to return to normal operations and complete the approval process. Applications that are received after the statutory deadline but before the tax rate is set by the NH Department of Revenue Administration in the fall will be accepted and can be considered under the law given the current situation. Incomplete applications will result in a request for additional information and may ultimately be cause for denial.

All of the city parks are open. We ask that you enjoy them but please adhere to social distancing protocols. The Parks and Recreation Department is currently working on ways to interact with the community through social media! Be on the lookout for posts meant to entertain, build community and to help people continue to exercise and take part in recreation opportunities during these times.
