The Projection & Gaming System will be used in the Community Center Game Room. The Department plans to use the system for closed circuit broadcasts of swim meets and basketball games. The system will also be used for our Xbox Connect games, CCTV and other programs while the facility is in use.



The FD630 is a native Full HD 1080p projector that includes the latest DLP technology for the sharpest definition to image details. The FD630 delivers super bright 4000 lumen images, and a contrast ratio of 2000:1. The FD630 projector is structurally airtight, eliminating the need for an intake filter under normal conditions and lowering costs. It also features an increased estimated lamp life of up to 5,000 hours in low mode.

Other convenient features include audio mix support with a built-in 10 watt speaker, visual PA support, closed caption capability and support for remote management and control via built-in RJ45 connectivity port.

## Veterans Memorial Park-Aquatic Feature



### Project Description

Estimated Cost: \$150,000 to \$250,000

The Parks & Recreation Department has often entertained the concept of an outdoor water feature for the public parks system. This amenity would replace the recently closed outdoor facility at Veterans Park. Unlike outdoor pools, an outdoor spray pad provides a variety of recreation and leisure opportunities for all ages and is less costly to manage and operate. Other impacts include:

- Uses less water and conserves our natural resources
- Serves a wider population, including those with physical limitations
- Complete automate system can be constructed for a portion of an in-ground commercial pool.
- Less maintenance and operational staff needed.
- Cost recovery is higher
- Unique play value for ages 2 through adult.
- Longer seasonal usage than a commercial pool. Can be open longer using less resources.



Donations for tree replacement and tree care will be used for ongoing planting, watering and maintenance of trees and gardens in the City's Parks System. The City's Forester will approve the location and type of tree replacement. The Park & Recreation Department will work directly with the donor and its gardener related to locations and plant varieties. A donor recognition plaque will be installed at the base of each tree and garden location.

## Scholarship Fund

### Project Description

The Scholarship Fund is established to provide youth and families who are economically or circumstantially disadvantaged with an opportunity to participate and be a part of a variety of positive recreational activities offered by the Claremont Parks & Recreation Department.

#### HOW THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND WORKS:

Applicants for scholarship funds will complete a scholarship request form or be referred to the Department of Parks and Recreation by a partner organization. The level of need shall be indicated by recipient or partner organization to receive funding. The Department supports many organizations (with common goals) and they are encouraged to establish a partnership with the Parks and Recreation Department for the purpose of establishing a scholarship fund. Scholarships are primarily for youth programs, activities and facility memberships; however, when adult participation is required as part of the activity, the adult's portion of the fee may also be covered by the scholarship guidelines. This includes, but is not limited to parent/child classes and family community center memberships.

#### FUNDING:

Funding is provided by private and public donations specifically identified for scholarships. All donations are deposited in the Scholarship Fund Account and can only be used for scholarship purposes. Scholarship applications are handled by the Department and qualifying applications are submitted for scholarship funding.
