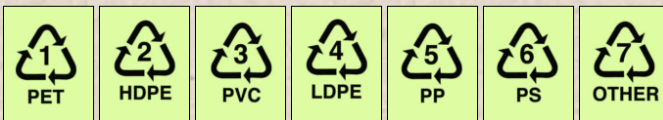

RECYCLING

Items may be disposed in four separate bins:

1. Commingled Recycling: Plastics & Metals

Plastic ratings # 1 - # 7 as marked on containers:



Soda, juice, water bottles
Milk jugs, shampoo bottles
Bleach & Detergent bottles

Food Containers:
Dairy tubs: cottage cheese,
margarine, yogurt

cans – tin, steel, aluminum
food and beverage cans
*labels are OK
*place lids inside can
aluminum and foil pie plates, trays
foil
empty aerosol containers
(do not puncture)

2. Cardboard

all corrugated cardboard
cereal, dry food boxes, shoe
boxes, paper towel and toilet
paper cores, brown paper
bags
milk, juice cartons (non-wax
coated)
egg cartons

3. Mixed Paper

newspapers
remove from plastic bags, do not tie
w/string
publications, glue or staple bound
magazines, catalogs, paperback
books, telephone books
direct mail and envelopes, all types
including "junk mail"
paper, all colors, loose, shredded
paper clips & staples OK

4. Glass

bottles and jars, mixed colors
accepted
ceramics
including toilet bowls (all
metal removed, covers)
windows
mirrors
dishes
Pyrex

Preparing your items for recycling:

- all items & containers must be rinsed and free of all contaminants (jars, bottles, cartons, etc.)
- remove and discard all corks, tops, rings, caps, metal bottleneck wraps, and unacceptable items (place with your household rubbish)
- flatten containers, break down boxes whenever possible

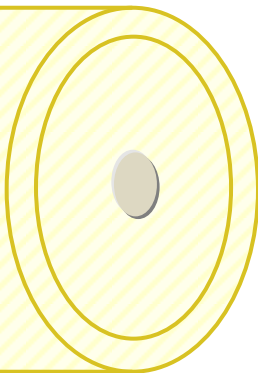
Category	Unacceptable Materials for Recycling
Plastics	Filmy or pliable pastics (grocery bags, bubble wrap), foam polystyrene (Styrofoam), products such as cups, take-out containers, packaging blocks and peanuts, housewares and office products, motor oil containers, electronics housing, biodegradable plastics (PLA), large plastic items and toys, tarps, any plastic item contaminated with food, oil, grease or which contains hazardous materials or pesticides
Metals	Oil filters, scrap metal, full or partially full cans including aerosol cans – dispose paint and cleansers accordingly, separate aerosol caps from the container, cans or aluminum with stuck-on food or grease
Cardboard & Paper	Pizza boxes, wrapping paper, foam packaging, Styrofoam, plastic covers or wrapping, hard-cover books (pages OK), tyvek or plastic envelopes, mailers padded with bubble wrap, wax-coated containers, CDs, VCR tapes, stickers, shredded credit cards, paper towels, tissue paper, all paper and cardboard items contaminated with food, paint, oil, pet waste, etc.
Glass	Light bulbs, windshield glass
Other	Paints, oil, hazardous materials, medical waste or sharps
Materials NOT ALLOWED	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Medicines, chemicals, explosives, radioactive materials ▪ Toxic waste including sewage ▪ Oil-based paint, solvents, varnishes, paint removers, driveway sealer ▪ Pesticides and Herbicides ▪ Asbestos items (shingles, tiles, etc.) ▪ Animal carcasses 	

More Recycling Options:

Batteries

metal, hydride, and nickel cadmium (ni-cad)
 rechargeable batteries
 small sealed lead acid
 lithium
 mercuric and silver oxide button batteries

NOTE: alkaline batteries— AA, AAA, C, D, 9-Volt may be placed in with your household rubbish



Other Items

“clean” oil and cell phones have separate locations; also mercury devices:

- fever and cooking thermometers
- thermostats ▪ weather barometers
- blood pressure cuffs

Leaf composting

occurs annually. Residents may bring leaves, grass rakings and twigs (must measure less than ½” in diameter) to the Transfer Station’s compost pile year-round at no cost. Note: wood stove ash is not accepted.



Small brush

½” to 5” in diameter and less than 6’ long: \$20.00 per pickup truck load. This brush gets put through the chipper. There is no longer burning at the Transfer Station; therefore, we do not accept any type of scrap wood products (old decking, building materials, etc.). Disposal of wood is considered demolition. Following the holiday season, you may bring your pine Christmas tree to the Transfer Station at no cost.
